Pastor's Pen

What does the Lord require of you, but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God? Micah 6:8

When Jesus commanded his disciples (and us) to "love one another as I have loved you" (John 15:12), he was well aware of the hatred that exists in this world.

People hate other people because of the way they look. People hate other people because of the way they worship. People hate other people because of their status, or lack of status. People are so easily swayed to hate.

Then Jesus comes into the picture and says, 'the world is going to hate you, but I tell you to love.' The disciples asked questions like, 'well what do we do if they're mean to us?' And Jesus told them to respond with love. 'What do we do if they try to destroy us?' Answer: love. 'What do we do if we can't see eye to eye?' Answer: love.

The prophet Micah tackled this too 700 years earlier. God doesn't require pomp and circumstance from us; God doesn't require sacrifices, God requires us to do justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with God.

And yet here we are, another 2,000 years later, with hatred permeating communities and even churches. Which makes me think that there is no better time than now to be beacons of love and light.

But we can't be beacons of love unless we commit ourselves to practicing love and kindness. This means when that person cuts us off, we can't show them a specific finger or shout unkind words. This means when someone seeks our forgiveness, we can't act like what they did is unforgivable. We can't gossip or lose our temper at the flip of a switch. Love and kindness takes practice.

The Apostle Paul said, "When I was a child I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child, but when I became an adult, I put an end to my childish ways." (1 Cor 13:11) Yet this world is full of people who have not put an end to their childish ways. There is still too much competition and jealousy and hatred in this world. But as Christians, we're called to love.

Who should we love? Everyone.

What about the people we don't trust? Love them.

What about the people we don't like? Love them.

And let's be an example for the world to see. Let our lights shine church! Shine for the love of Christ!
