Most of you know my son, Jeremy. He has been a band teacher in Boston, MA for the last three years in Winchester School District That district was very affluent and money flowed freely to

education the children. This year he is with the Malden School District which is considered a high need district. He is teaching grades five through eight band. Over 70% of the children qualify for reduced lunches. This district has no line in their budget for him to purchase instruments.

He has found a website, <u>donorschoose.org</u> where if you search for his last name, Hachten, his wish list of instruments will pop up, and anyone may then donate cash. When his cash goal is met, the instruments are automatically purchased and sent to his school.

He is hoping to meet the goal of \$1,863.00. He will then receive the instruments that he is in need of; which are, three alto saxophones, one clarinet, four flutes, and one trombone. These are not top of the line instruments, but are of good quality and durable. Having these instruments will help him start some of his students who cannot afford to rent or purchase their own instrument in band.

As you all know, music education not only improves your quality of life, but also helps to achieve even better grades in the core subjects. So, I hope all of you will give this some though, and if you are able to donate, it will be very much appreciated by my son and all of his students.

Call to Order: Pastor Elizabeth lead us in the devotion and Lord's Prayer.

• **Meeting Minutes:** Minutes were reviewed. A change was made to carpentry cost. It was \$1,600.00 and not \$5,000.00. A motion was made to approve by Barb and seconded by Jeff. Motion was passed.

• Pastor's Report:

- 1. Thanks to Charlotte who did extra work last week since I was out most of the week with bronchitis.
- 2. We're hopeful more people will buy tickets to the Anniversary dinner. The history team has been working hard to put on a great celebration with worship and the dinner on October 20th, but currently they have only sold about 100 tickets to the dinner (we're hoping to sell 150).
- 3. Second round of church t-shirts was placed and will be available for pickup on Sunday, October 20th.
- 4. Hearts and Hands speaker will join us at both services and coffee hours on Sunday, November 24th.
- 5. Breakfast with Santa set for December 21st.

Committee Reports:

- Administration- child care givers needed. They will be paid.
- Christian Education Edie reported that the kids are preparing for a December 15 program.
- Missions- no report.

- Health Ministry -Flu shots to be given from 9-10:30 AM Sunday.
- Strategy Planning (SWOC) Parking lot striping to be done. Pipelines to be dug up by a contractor for inspection. Daycare/preschool -Tim reported that George Drescher will present information on requirements for a daycare/preschool.

- 175th Anniversary Planning- buy tickets! Jeff showed a picture of previous and present pastors. A songbook is being put together.
- New Environmental Ministry:
 - a. Committee Members: Barb Miller, Jeff Quinton, Sarah Handley-Cousins, Bill Roberts, Pastor Elizabeth
 - b. Barb, Jeff and Pastor Elizabeth met to put together a list of recommendations
 - i. The Environmental Committee recommends that the church not use lawn chemicals, especially pesticides, and when they are used a more organic option should be selected.
 - Ray Greiner added that when lawn chemicals were recently used they made the side lot too thick and difficult to cut. He recommends we only have the lawn sprayed every few years when dandelions get too difficult to control.
 - ii. Recommend no scents in the bathrooms
 - iii. Consider buying environmentally friendly coffee cups (Consistory should buy these, not the coffee hour crew).
 - iv. Recommend planting tree line next to highway fence on side lot. We envision having a line of apple trees if possible. And if the apple trees do well, consider adding picnic tables.
 - v. Introduce Dunkirk Camp and Conference Center recycling program there is a program at Dunkirk where we collect items, they recycle them, and they get the proceeds. Details to come.
 - vi. Future idea: with the upcoming ban of plastic bags in NY state, we could make and sell reusable bags made out of either canvas, hemp, or cotton.

Old Business:

- Handicap accessibility tabled.
- Community Garden- no update.
- Church banner to be put up next week.
- Monday evening Bible study going well.

New Business:

- Coffee Hour- need more volunteers for coffee hour and community dinners. Have the youth group help. Have a signup sheet for volunteers to bake treats. Gluten and allergen free treats needed.
- Budget- see handouts by Ron. A motion was made by Barb and seconded by Jeff to increase OCWM budget to \$5,000.00. Approved. A motion was made by Glen and seconded by Edie for Ron to make changes and Trustees to review. Approved.
