Lent is about to begin!

We're getting creative for Ash Wednesday! February, Wednesday 17th, is Ash Wednesday. And even though we're holding a virtual service, you can still receive your ashes! Here is the game plan for the start of Lent.

Drive-Thru Ashes

From 12:30-1pm and 6:00-6:30pm

Drive into the church parking lot and pull up near the entrance (like the community dinner). Pastor Elizabeth will meet you at the car, with a mask on (please wear yours as well) and administer the ashes to all in the car who would like to receive them. You are welcome to receive ashes on your forehead or on your hand. The pastor will also give you a take-home communion.

Virtual Service

Then at 7:00pm we will have an Ash Wednesday Service online. The service will run about 30 minutes.

If you have never participated in Ash Wednesday, now will be a great time to check it out. Ash Wednesday truly helps us to prepare for the Season of Lent which leads us to the Cross of Christ.



What is *Ash Wedhesd*ay?

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent. Its official name is "Day of Ashes," so called because of the practice of rubbing ashes on one's forehead in the sign of a cross. Ash Wednesday and Lent are observed by most Catholics and some Protestant denominations.

Zion UCC Consistory Meeting Minutes via Zoom® 1-12-2021

Call to Order: Tim Schlegel called the meeting to order.

Members Present: Pastor Elizabeth, Tim Schlegel, Jeff Quinton, Edie Baur, Debby Williams, Glen Gordon, Barb Miller, Troy Hengst, Peter Korte. Excused: Jason Whelan.

Call to Order at 7:05 pm.

Devotion and Lord's Prayer: Pastor Elizabeth led us in the devotion and Lord's prayer.

- Approval of Consistory Meeting Minutes: A motion to accept was made by Troy and seconded by Barb. Motion was passed.
- **Treasurer's Report:** Report was reviewed. A motion was made by Debby and seconded by Edie to accept the Treasurer's Report. Motion was passed.
- **Trustees's Report:** Lights were installed on pole near new storage shed by Ed Miller. **Thank you to Ed!** Troy moved to accept . Motion was passed.
- **Budget Discussion:** Pastor Elizabeth was asked to leave the meeting so they could discuss her salary. Tim discussed Pastor Elizabeth's raise. She is in her 11th year and should be moved into the 11-15 year bracket for a pay increase. Barb mentioned a three month sabbatical for Elizabeth. Tim said that she may do it later when her kids are more independent. (Pastor Elizabeth later said that she will have a two week sabbatical in Israel when conditions permit. Another two weeks could be done at another time.) Barb asked if we could fund mini-sabbaticals during the year. She has a Master of Divinity and should go to the 11th year pay bracket beginning January 1st 2021.
- Pastor Elizabeth said that the church budget will be snail mailed to members of the congregation. This will allow members to think of questions before the congregational meeting. Glen mentioned that the sound quality was poor during the roof meeting in the Sanctuary. Tim said that Ron rolled the 2020 budget over into 2021. Debby asked about an associate Pastor. A motion was made to accept the budget by Barb and seconded by Debby. Motion was passed.

• Pastor's Report:

- 1. Thank you to volunteers who helped on the Sunday after Christmas to deliver flowers and gifts! Community dinners were all given out.
- 2. We can put together a survey to find out when people would like to resume in-person worship (with livestream) do they want to wait until the vaccine roll-out has covered

more people, or are some eager to return with restrictions? This was discussed and it was decided by Consistory to wait until next month to discuss returning to in-person.

- 3. Newsletter is delayed but will go out next week.
- Pastor Elizabeth is the new Western Area Moderator she can serve two, two year terms.
- 5. We have many envelopes remaining. I'm wondering if we could get a team together to deliver envelopes (for people who are not giving online).
- 6. We should plan the next couple months of community dinner volunteers/menus.
- 7. Ash Wednesday is February 17th. We could have a service online and also drive by ashes. Sanitizer would be used after giving ashes to each person.
