Message from the Pastor

Happy May, Church!

I'm writing this and looking outside at the blooming trees and listening to some Christian music and even though this world is a crazy place, I'm filled with hope and promise. I know not everyone feels this way, because there is hatred and violence in this world and sometimes that takes over our mind, but I have realized that my hopefulness is encouraged by some of my daily practices (like my own little life hacks).

So I'm going to share these practices with you. Maybe you have time to include them in your daily regimen.

- 1. I start my day with scripture. I don't read much in the morning, because I have to get up and get the kids and myself ready for the day, but a simple verse or two thanks to the daily Bible app is enough to put my mind in the right place.
- 2. I listen almost exclusively to Christian music. Yes there's some Taylor Swift mixed in there, but I listen to Christian music throughout the day. Some of the songs just go by, but occasionally a song pops on that let's me praise God. Especially when in the car!
- 3. I take time to breathe and be present. There's an old Rob Bell Nooma video where he talks about breathing, and how when we breathe, it's like we're saying the name of God. (Breath in) Yah, (breathe out) weh. Breathing allows us to present in the moment and breathe in the power of the Holy Spirit. And it's important to be present. Not looking ahead, not looking behind, just present and in the moment.
- 4. I give myself permission to step away from the constant news broadcasts. I know that there are many serious concerns in this world that need my attention, but I also know that it's my responsibility to take care of myself psychologically. I make a difference in the world where I can, I give to organizations that I think are doing important work, but I remember, daily, to take care of my own psychological health, and sometimes that means stepping away.
- 5. I make myself take time for Sabbath rest. The key word in that sentence is "make". One thing that the Jewish tradition gets right that we somehow lost is the idea of Sabbath rest. God created the Sabbath for us. Our human bodies require rest, without rest, we become psychologically unwell; without rest we become highly stressed and anxious; without rest our bodies become weak from overexertion. So sometimes I make myself rest. This isn't easy, because my mind is more hyperactive than my body, and it likes to race. But when I remember that God created the Sabbath for us, I know my mortal body and brain need time for Sabbath rest.

These are my 5 practices for a healthy Spiritual (and psychological) life. What about you? I know this world is chaotic; I also know that no matter who we are or what our roles are, we can take time to live spiritually healthy lives. And when our lives are spiritually healthy, we find ourselves filled with hope and the promises of God.

Zion UCC Consistory Meeting Minutes via Zoom® 3-9-2021

Call to Order: Tim Schlegel called the meeting to order.

Members Present: Pastor Elizabeth, Tim Schlegel, Jeff Quinton, Edie Bauer, Glen Gordon, Barb Miller, Troy Hengst, Peter Korte, Trustee: Ted Camp. Excused: Debby Williams, Jason Whalen.

Call to Order at 7:05 pm.

Devotion and Lord's Prayer: Pastor Elizabeth lead us in the devotion and Lord's prayer. **Approval of Consistory Meeting Minutes:** A motion to accept was made by Troy and seconded by Edie. Motion was passed.

Treasurer's Report:

As of 04/02/2021 there is a balance of \$48,668.57 in the operating account and \$19504.94 in the restricted funds account.

The revenue for March was \$13,364.19 and the net income was \$1099.55. The budgeted March revenue was \$14,434.58 and the net income budgeted was \$-5576.63. The budgeted YTD revenue was \$48,144.77 and the budgeted YTD net income was \$-5001.63. The actual YTD revenue is \$43,701.61 and the actual YTD net income is \$6013.62.

Notable P&L events in March included the quarterly payments to the UCC: \$1250.00 for OWCM, \$630.00 for Western Area and \$210.00 for the per capita fee.

The revenue continues to remain stable as a result of the continued support of our congregation. As long as we maintain the same attitude we have used since last March, we will continue to remain in good shape.

Report was reviewed. A motion was made by Barb and seconded by Jeff to accept the Treasurer's Report. Motion was passed.

Trustees's Report: Ted discussed meeting with the security systems consultant. Cameras could be added to monitor entrances and new garage. The cost could be reduced by having Ed Miller do the wiring. The consultant would install the system. Ted discussed installing numeric keypads on the doors. An additional quote could be provided. Monitoring would be done by the security company. Tim asked what the cost would be. Ted said that fire monitoring costs \$30.00/mo. Total cost is \$4,500.00. This includes \$2,000 for installation. This would be reduced if Ed does the wiring.

Pastor's Report:

- 1. Annual Reports emailed and snail mailed to those who receive a hard copy of the Zionite. Extra copies available in the back of the Sanctuary.
- 2. I'll begin permitted nursing home visitations after my second vaccination.
- 3. With re-opening plan, we need to discuss Easter Sunday and the possibility of an outdoor egg hunt? We could have a 9AM traditional service with Arrow at the organ and an 11AM contemporary service.
- 4. I'll be on vacation the week after Easter. Rev. Rick Danielson will preach on Sunday, April 11th. Rev. Danielson recently transferred his membership to Zion after moving back to the area he was also my pastor and mentor when I began ministry.
- 5. Thank you to our anonymous donor who funded \$1,000 to go to our new camera. Thank you to Jeff, Ed, and Dave for our new plexiglass. And thank you for the help from Zak Zientek and Mike Durshordwe (and again Ed and Dave!) for helping install our new camera.
- 6. Would we like to put in our annual Easter ad in the KenTon Bee? Decision was not this year.
- 7. We need two alternates for Consistory. An email is to be sent out.

Environmental Ministry- Met with the Community Foundation of Buffalo. One million dollars was received from the Tonawanda Coke settlement. Grants of \$25,000.00 are to be made available. Zion could use one to create a park in our side lot. A draft of the proposal will be sent to the Trustees and the grant request will be submitted to the TC settlement.

Old Business:

Pastoral Care Ministry Training: Thirty people plus one trainer costs \$3,300.00. This includes the trainer's travel, lodging and time as well as meals for all. Cost is approximately \$110.00/person on a Saturday and Sunday.
