# Message from the Pastor

Hello Church!

To say there is a lot going on in church would be an understatement! We're a busy community of faith here at Zion, and it makes me so happy! (I'll try to calm down with the exclamation points now...)

Here is some of what is going on here at church:

- 1. Office renovations. If you didn't hear, shortly before our roof was replaced, there was flooding in the offices. This led to some much needed renovations. Peek your head in the offices as you walk by them on Sunday and you'll see the progress. It also explains why my desk is currently in the fellowship hall. Thank you to our Trustees for this much needed renovation!
- 2. New members!!! I love when people find their way to this church. The main theme that came up at our New Member Meeting was that people were looking for a church that is inclusive. I love that this Church is both Christ-centered and inclusive, and that our mission is evident to those who walk through the doors or join us online. I know I can speak on behalf of the whole church when I say, "Welcome New Members!" On October 31st we will officially welcome the new members into this Congregation.
- 3. Committee/Ministry Team revival. Covid took a hit on our Committees and Ministry Teams. So on Tuesday, October 12th, at 7pm, we're having our first Committee Night. If anyone is a part of a committee or looking to be a part of one, this is the night to attend! We will be meeting in-person this month. The Committee Night is only an hour long, and at 8pm Consistory will gather to discuss what happened at each of the Committee meetings.
- 4. Slowly getting back to normal. Our 9am service attendance is increasing, which is part of why Consistory wanted to move back to 2 services. And our 11am service attendance is a little low, but that's okay! In fact, it's great! There is plenty of room to spread out and the choir is providing amazing music! If you've been wary about attending church inperson, the second service has a lighter attendance and is probably the safest option. For those who worship with us online, you can continue to do so. Streaming of our services will continue.
- 5. New ministry opportunities are coming. Right now we have a small team preparing to meet with the WNYACIC and Journey's End Refugee Services to participate in the Home Again+ program with other WNY churches so that we can help a family coming into Buffalo from Afghanistan. As a sister of a soldier who was in Army intelligence in Afghanistan, I believe it's important for us to help the refugees and allies coming from Afghanistan. If you feel the same, there will soon be ways to help! Our ministry team will let us know what ways we can help in the near future.

I'm sure there is more that I should update you on, but it looks like I'm almost out of room. But I will tell you that it's amazing to serve a church that is passionate about following Jesus and welcoming all. I'm genuinely happy to be your pastor and I'm so glad to see many of you in church again!



#### **Our Future**

Birthday Buddies would like to reach as many children in Western New York that are in need. We plan to do this in various ways. Presently we are researching Boys and Girls Clubs to see if there is a need for the children they serve. Many school social workers have children who may not be homeless but can not celebrate their birthdays because their families cannot afford it. Birthday Buddies could provide Birthday Boxes to the school so the child could celebrate at school and receive a special gift. For older children the boxes would contain a cake mix, frosting, candles, some party supplies and a special gift. This way the children could celebrate at home. These are some ways we can reach children through out Western New York.





#### Why We Are

In 2020 the Homeless Alliance of Western New York found that there were 6,375 people without homes. Of that number many were single parents with children.

The impact of homelessness on a child can be traumatic. Birthday Buddies believes a birthday party can bring a sense of stability and normalcy into a family's environment. Since the pandemic Birthday Buddies has continued to serve the children of Western New York by providing a Birthday in A Box. We provide a complete birthday party celebration once a month with the following:



#### Zion UCC Consistory Meeting Minutes via Zoom ® 9-7-2021

Call to Order: Tim Schlegel called the meeting to order.

Members Present: Tim Schlegel, Troy Hengst, Pastor Elizabeth, Barb Miller, Trustee: Ted Camp, Elena Camp, Sarah Handley-Cousins, Edie Bauer.

Call or Order at 7:06 pm. (Lacking voting body)

**Devotion and Lord's Prayer:** Pastor led us in the devotion and Lord's prayer.

#### **Community Building**

#### **COVID Review Policy**

- Will keep 2 (two) services at 9:00 am and 11:00am with coffee hour starting at the conclusion of the first service.
- Coffee hour team will be needed. Pastor will create a sign-up sheet to request volunteers each week. Volunteers will serve children that come up for a snack or drink.
- Will further review the coffee hour with regards to our COVID policy as the need arises and/or with increases in COVID/Variant cases in the community.

#### Tim Schlegel acknowledges voting body achieved at 7:15 pm.

- Approval of Consistory Meeting Minutes: No minutes were submitted. Will have to add and approve at the next meeting.
- Treasurer's Report: Report was reviewed. A motion was made by Barb and seconded by Troy to accept the Treasurer's Report. Motion was passed. Ron requested to get started on the next budget and have it submitted by November.
- Trustee's Report: Remediation of office, asbestos testing resulted in NO asbestos.
   Parking lot working on RFP. Dead tree on Parker Street side of the church looking to have removed. Old shed in back has been taken down. Boiler inspection requested by insurance carrier went well, all okay.

#### Pastor's Report

- 1. Rally day is 9/12/21. One service at 10:00 am, outside service. Requesting volunteers to help set-up, cook/prepare lunch, tear down/clean-up.
- 2. New member meeting changed to 9/28 at 6:00 pm. Pastor noted about 15 new members are in waiting to join the church.
- 3. New member ministry team. Possibly 3-4 per team to help welcome new members and to also keep in contact with new members.
- 4. Pastor sent out a thank you to the Trustees for their hard work on the office renovations.

#### Committee Discussion

Reimagine / Ministry Teams

It was discussed on creating various ministry teams in areas of interest/need, having a liaison of each team report to the Consistory, who will share a report during the first segment of the meeting. The first segment would be reserved for ministry team reporting then continue into the regular meeting (second segment). It is possible that not all ministry teams would meet on a regular or more frequent basis, and that it may report only a few times during the year.

#### Committee Reports:

- Administration Charlotte signed new contract for 6 work hours.
- Christian Education & Missions Had a successful VBS and now ready for a new Sunday School year with all of our teachers returning.
- Church Life and Community Dinners Troy reported no community dinner for August and that the next dinner is September 25.
- Memorials None
- Outreach None
- PPRC None
- Health Ministry None
- Environmental Ministry Barb reported attending a native tree preservation workshop, learning/looking around at trees and other shrubs/plants to include in the green space/future project next to our parking lot.

It was brought to Pastor's attention that there is a need to include in our committee reports, Food Pantry. This is a vital area of the church that should be reported on each month.

 Troy recapped the Pastoral Care Training from July. The training went well! There were 12 attendees from 5 different WNY Area Churches. Seven attendees were from Zion. Roll out with ministry teams will be announced soon.
