

### Hello Church!

And welcome to your summer Zionite! We won't send out another newsletter until the end of summer. Hopefully you can find all of the information you need about our summer events here.

Before you begin perusing the newsletter for events and information, I wanted to share a song with you. The song is by Cochran & Co called "Be There For You". It's a beautiful song about being there for loved ones when they're going through death/loss/struggle/pain. It's a song (and a band) that I absolutely love. Here's a snapshot of the lyrics: "No, I can't fix this feeling, but I'll be there for you. I know pain doesn't heal overnight, It grips your heart and it holds on tight. I just wanna be there for you right now."

Part of being a Christian is showing compassion, and the best way we can show compassion is to be there for others. If someone is grieving, we don't need to say any magic words, we just need to be there for them. If someone is struggling, they might not need more advice, they might just need a friend.

When my brother died, my best friends wouldn't leave my side. They were physically with me the entire time I was in Massachusetts. One of them even flew home from England to be there for me, with her youngest child in tow. And at that moment I knew how much I just needed them to be there for me.

So maybe someone you know is struggling, or grieving. Don't be afraid to reach out, especially if you're afraid to do/say the wrong thing. Just be there for them. If they need you around, be there. If they need some space, tell them you're nearby whenever they need a friend. Check in on those who are struggling, because they might just need you to be there for them.

Jesus teaches us this—he says that there will sickness, hunger, war, and all that bad stuff, but he also shows us how to be present with those who suffer. Instead of running and hiding, simply be there. Even if you can't make it better, just be there.

I do recommend you listen to this song—and a few others by them as well! Cochran & Co might actually be my favorite band at the moment.

And if you need someone to "be there for you" come to church. Join the Youth Group or Women's Fellowship; have coffee with some guys from church; build those relationships, and I know that your siblings in Christ will be here for you, no matter what life throws your way.




### Requirements:

When: Wednesday, May 31st



Consistory Call to Order at 7:05 pm by Dave Dombrowski

Members present: Pastor Elizabeth, Dave Dombrowski, W. George Darrall, Elena Camp, Debby Williams, Rev. Pierre Albrecht-Carrie, Kalee Mielke and Trustee, Ted Camp. Absent: Mark Burr, Sarah Handley-Cousins, Peter Korte, Edie Bauer and Robin Fowler

Devotion and Lord's Prayer: Pastor Elizabeth led us in the devotion and the Lord's Prayer.

Approval Of Consistory Meeting Minutes - motioned for approval by Dave D. and seconded by George D. All attending members approved.

### Treasurer's Report (Ron Janiszewski)

- As of 05/02/2023 there is a balance of \$54,334.20 in the operating account and \$18,030.91 in the restricted funds account. The payroll for 05/05/23 is already accounted for in this balance.
- The revenue for April was \$14,405.93 and the net income was \$2276.35. In comparison: The revenue for April 2022 was \$14,679.58. The net income for April 2022 was \$-2,564.60. YTD revenue for 2023 is \$69,616.47. YTD income for 2023 is \$8,832.71. In comparison the YTD revenue for 2022 was \$57,122.89 and the net income was \$-3907.10.
- The only notable P&L event in April was the payment of the workers comp premium for \$697.00 Congregational support remains strong. The year is starting off on a better than anticipated positive note.

### Trustee's Report: Ted Camp

- 1. Security System: there is a need for adjustments in placement and power backup. Being worked on.
- 2. Parking lot; got lot design-will be straight and no longer diagonal in design
- 3. Maintenance of generator: Consistory needs to have a maintenance program lined up. Will need to be addressed in another monthly meeting,
- 4. New Board member needed to replace Rob Voss. Our Constitution and By-laws state that a youth member (under 21) is needed on the Board. Motion was made by Pastor Duffy to be the new youth member. All attending members approved. Jacob has graciously accepted.
- 5. Fundraising Envisioning: discussion about ling term planning. Trustees will discuss it at their next several meetings.
- 6. Rob Voss Scholarship- Trustees discussed a vision to address funding in some way for this to happen. Kids selected will need to qualify for the selection process.

- We have Dunkirk Scholarship Money available, see Pastor Duffy for assistance.
- We are hosting a small group (about 13) for a youth mission trip from Billerica, MA July 10-16 (her mom's church, the same church that hosted our youth group last year).
- Nathan has received the Internship for Environmental Ministry for this summer grant money was already received to pay Nathan.
- Youth Mission Trip is July 17-23. Kalee will preach on the 23rd of July.

- 1. The Youth Group is heading north to Massena, NY for the mission trip this July No Committee Reports this time due to committee meeting of new and existing members
