One of the highlights of my summer was our Youth Mission Trip to Massena, NY. We took a total of 51 youth and adults to Massena, where they worked hard to remove invasive Japanese Knot Wood (similar to Bamboo), helped clear land for a new Habitat for Humanity house, and worked with seniors in the community to repaint a porch and other miscellaneous tasks. You'll find pictures in this newsletter, so I want to share some of the most meaningful moments I took away from this trip:

First, our youth are phenomenal. Seriously, they're great kids. Watching them grow up through the challenges of teenage life into the wonderful young adults they're becoming is a privilege. The way in which our teenagers support one another and care for one another is beautiful. Watching them grow into people who own their faith is a powerful thing to witness.

Second, our youth are seriously hard workers! I hope you can tell from the pictures how hard these kids work. I had to bring a sandwich out to Brennan one day because he didn't want to take a break for lunch! Do they have fun? Yes! But do they work hard all week? You bet!

Third, I can't express what a privilege it is to work alongside our young adult leaders who, just a few years ago, were teenagers themselves. You'll find a picture in the next pages from the free day with Brianna, Megan, Zak, and myself. I was able to spend the day with these 3 amazing adults, and all I can say is that I hope my own children grow up the way these young adults have!

Lastly (and I could go on...), working with our sister churches for youth group and mission trips benefits our own kids and our area churches tremendously. The connections our kids have from youth group, to mission trips, to camp at Dunkirk, creates a network of young people of faith who grow up with one another through faith-based programs. I can't express how fortunate we are to have this network! This year, my son's homeroom and science teacher is an adult who I have known for years because she goes to our sister church and attended mission trips with me as a teen!

If you have kids or grandkids, I highly recommend getting them involved with Dunkirk and Youth Group as soon as possible!!

We also plan to connect spirituality with bread making in fun creative ways.


AnnMarie Destino will teach bread-making and Kalee

During Sunday worship, before we left Massena at the end of the Mission Trip, some of the kids were asked to share reflections. Madi, who has been attending Zion along with her boyfriend, Nathan Hengst, and attended the mission trip, shared this reflection:

"I didn't grow up going to church, so the only experience I had was horror stories from my parents of judgmental Sundays when they were forced to attend by their parents or reports of people using the Bible to promote hatred and prejudice. That's what I expected to find when I went with my boyfriend and his family. But Instead I found a group of people that used their religion to promote peace rather than to scold and shame. Though it was my first day, I could feel the community. So I kept coming back. Now I know that I am a part of that community.

This trip has only further solidified this feeling. Most of the people here already knew one another but I never once felt excluded. I've made so many friends this week and been able to help many people and for that I am grateful.

Honestly, I'm still discovering if I believe in Jesus, but I do believe in love, acceptance, forgiveness, and friendship. All of which I have found this week."


