

Dear Church,

I like reading devotionals and reflections, and recently one of them had some advice from Rev. Dr. Brian McLaren that caught my attention. This was the advice:

Lifelong Learning: Do not think the knowledge you presently possess is changeless, complete, and absolute truth.... Be open to the Holy Spirit and practice childlike humility...

There are some people who claim to know everything concretely. But even the Apostle Paul understood that he didn't know all that there was to know. In 1 Cor 13:12b, he says, "Now I know only in part, then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known." That's Paul's way of saying that when his life is complete, and he sees God face to face in the Kingdom of Heaven, he will finally know all there is to know, but until then, his knowledge is incomplete.

I find that when people are arrogant about their beliefs, they become judgmental, and sometimes mean. **But our faith, all rooted in the salvific grace of Jesus, should not be arrogant or judgmental.** If we believe that Jesus gave us the power of the Holy Spirit, then we should be open to God's guidance in the most powerful, profound and unorthodox ways.

If you were here on Christmas Eve, you heard me talk about St. Francis, and his love for nature and his decorating the trees with lights to show God's love. St. Francis had a constant, childlike "wonder" as he experienced God and God's love. He was open to the Holy Spirit, he didn't focus on absolute truths, but he worshipped God in a deeply spiritual and experiential way. I think St. Francis would have loved the advice from Brian McLaren above.

So while we live in a world that is full of people claiming concrete truths, let us hold on to the Truth of Jesus, but otherwise be open to the works of the Holy Spirit all around us. Let us feel the presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives and worship God with a childlike wonder. Let us be guided by God's presence and be filled with God's joy. There's a lot of heaviness in this world, but there's also wonder. And God wants us to find Him in that wonder.





Zion UCC Consistory Meeting Minutes 01.09.2024

Consistory Call to Order at 7:08 pm by Edie Bauer

Due to weather, meeting was on Google Meet. Members present: Pastor Elizabeth, Dave Dombrowski, Elena Camp, Debby Williams, Rev. Pierre Albrecht-Carrie, Kalee Mielke, Edie Bauer and Trustee, Ted Camp and, W. George Darrall, and Robin Fowler

Absent: Sarah Handley-Cousins, and Rev. Pierre Albrecht-Carrie

Approval Of Consistory Meeting Minutes - motioned for approval by Dave and seconded by Robin. All attending members approved.

Treasurer's Report

- As of 1/6/2024 there is a balance of \$50,449.23 in the operating account and \$13482.54 in the restricted funds account.
- The revenue for December was \$12,525.26. The net income was \$-10,448.35. In comparison: The revenue for December 2022 was \$20,052.42. The net income for December 2022 was
- \$-1991.94. YTD revenue for 2023 was \$188,362.91. YTD income for 2023 was \$-8021.37. In comparison the YTD revenue for 2022 was \$190,118.73 and the net income was \$8790.08.
- The notable P&L events in December were:
- December was a 3-payroll month. This accounts for an additional \$4,500.00 in expense
- 54701 Property Insurance This \$3,677.75 was for the payment due January 1st. Since this expense is falling back under the general budget, this expense line will have to be added to the budget with the full cost of \$14,711.00 for 2024.
- 54502 Treasurer Supplies \$705.79 was for the annual renewal of the QuickBooks product
- We did end the year in the negative. This is not catastrophic since we have enjoyed several good years of surplus. However, as he mentioned previously this year, we must remain very cognizant of the fact that we are adding \$14,711.00 in expense for the insurance premium. A plan will need to be put in place to help absorb this expense or we will very rapidly deplete our funds.
- The donations for Christmas Eve will not be reflected till the January financials since they were not actually deposited until January 2, 2024.

Kalee's Member in Discernment (MID)

- She is mentoring a student in CPE program who is interested in hospice pastoral care.
- She is taking her last two classes: Preaching and Being Mission. She will graduate May 18,2024
- Meeting with Rev. John Lord about preaching at his church a few times.
- She is helping with a funeral this Friday 1/12.
- She is bringing Enzo, her dog to Hospice visits and has plans to get him certified to become a therapy dog so he can become a Hospice visitation dog.

Trustee's Report: Ted Camp

- Trustees did not meet in December.
- It was mentioned at new member meeting on 1/9 about getting additional television or larger ones for services. Ted will bring it up at next Trustees meeting.

Pastor's Report (Pastor Duffy)

- Had new member orientation on Monday 1/08. We have 11 new people who want to become
 members. January 21st will be the services when they become members of our church and Maddie will be
 baptized that day as well.
- A picture was donated that has Jesus with children. It was donated by Ron Hewitt's family and is currently hanging in the Children's Nursery
- Ted mentioned about pledge cards/stewardship and Pastor Duffy discussed about printing them in the bulletins and having Ted announce the pledge cards/stewardship.
- Bible study during Lent-TBA
- Ash Wednesday is February 14
- Annual Mission trip is being planned for July. Going to Michigan. Youth group retreat is planned for February.

- Jr. Way is having a Carnival Day March 9 from 9:30-11:30 am at Ebenezer UCC Church 630 Main Street in West Seneca. All children K-6 are welcomed to attend.
- Sr. Way (young adults) are planning their mission trip for next year and will be working with Habitat for Humanity.
