Pastor's Letter:

This means your name, or the name of the person you are giving in memory of, will be on our donation plaque for the Walking Path.




For a donation of \$300, you can be a Bench Level Donor. This means your name, or the name of the person you are giving in memory of, will be on our donation plaque for the Benches.

Durkirk Mother's Memorial

Mothers Memorial Appeal Update - April 2025

Thank you from the DCC Board of Trustees to everyone who donated to the Mother's Memorial Appeal. Through your generous donations, we have raised \$65,000 leaving us just \$15,000 short of our goal. We are blessed to have such good support from our Dunkirk family.

There is still time to donate to help preserve this beautiful Arts and Crafts building. The ways to donate are included below.

The Board has determined that we will need a new roof on Mother memorial. The 5 dormer windows will also need to be replaced. This project will be one of the largest we have taken on in recent years. We are projecting a budget of \$80,000 for this major project.

This structure was designed to serve as an all-purpose assembly hall. Construction began in 1923, with funds collected from the Atlantic, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana and New York State Sunday School leagues. From these groups the primary fund raisers were mothers who lost their sons in World War I. Later, as a fitting tribute this building was renamed...Mothers Memorial. Please consider donating In Memory of or In Honor of your Mother/Grandmother or a Veteran as we help maintain this beautiful

Arts and Crafts building and a centerpiece of our camp. This could be a year-end gift or possibly a pledge over the next 3 years.
